MEDITATION FOR TODAY

“Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him.” This was probably the first time the leper had ever been touched. That contact was just as compelling as his cure. The leper perceives in Jesus a compassion, a “pity.” Sickness and suffering can be a powerful occasion to experience the tenderness and goodness of another. Most likely the leper never would have begged Jesus as he did if he had not been afflicted in the first place. “I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble.” The leper presents himself to the Great High Priest, who “fills him with the joy of salvation.” Our sufferings, like the leper’s ailment, can be precisely what draw us close to Jesus.

BUNCO Buzzzz

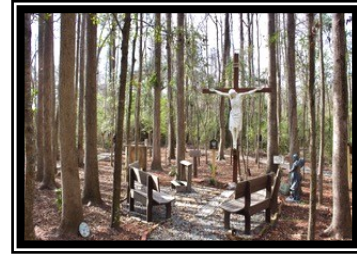

Evangelization

February 11– Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings deal with a case of leprosy—a disease that was found in the time of Jesus. The story shows these things about Jesus: his power, his pity and his purpose. The leper expresses his faith that Jesus has the power, but he hopes that Jesus has the will. As it turns out, Jesus' love gives him the compassion to have pity and his perfect divine purpose gave the leper the needed healing. Symbolically, leprosy could be looked on like sin and sin is the reason he came and died for us.

Next Sunday is the first Sunday of Lent. Lenten booklets will be available to help us prepare for this holy season...one per family
