Evangelization

January 5, 2025–Epiphany of the Lord

Although the Gospel does not specify who or what the Magi were...today's Gospel message cannot be over emphasized! In the scheme of God's plan, the world was waiting for the promised Messiah at Jesus' birth. Church tradition reveals this fact to us... that three wise men (astrologers) did, in fact, come to worship Jesus at his birth. We can only marvel at this event that presents itself to us every Christmas! Only God could have been the one to orchestrate the original event. Since the seventh century, the Magi have been identified in Western Christianity as Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar bringing gifts of frankincense, gold and myrrh. Jesus speaking in The Poem of the Man God on page 176 says "The three Wise Men were really great. Firstly, because of their supernatural virtues, secondly because of their science, last because of their wealth. But they feel that they are nothing: dust on the dust of the earth, in comparison with the Most High God." Note also, that they are considered saints by the Catholic Church.
