MEDITATION FOR TODAY

We may think the doctrine of the Trinity is too complicated or abstract to make much of a difference in our daily life. Yet “the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching” (CCC 234). The Trinity is who God really is: a real, personal, wise, and loving God. And because he has revealed to us who he really is, we can really speak to him and love him: “O my Three, my all, my beatitude, infinite solitude, immensity in which I lose myself....

Bury yourself in me that I may bury myself in you until I depart to contemplate in your light the abyss of your greatness” (Saint Elizabeth of the Trinity). Life with the Trinity is truly the whole point of the Christian faith and the goal of every human life.

The Most Holy Trinity-Solemnity

Psalm 8: 22-31 seems to sum up the Most Holy Trinity—"Before the earth was made, Wisdom was conceived." In The Showings by the English mystic, Julian of Norwich (1342-1416), one way to understand the Most Holy Trinity was described..."Greatly ought we to rejoice that God dwells in our soul; and more greatly ought we to rejoice that our souls dwell in God...for the almighty truth of the Trinity is our Father, for he made us and keeps us in him. And the deep wisdom of the Trinity is our mother, in whom we are enclosed. And the high goodness of the Trinity is our Lord, and in him we are enclosed and he in us. We are enclosed in the Father, and we are enclosed in the Son, and we are enclosed in the Holy Spirit. And the Father is enclosed in us, almighty, all wisdom and all goodness, one God, one Lord."
